ABSTRACT

The uniqueness of teaching and learning processes of English in modern *pesantrens* leads to an investigation of the English curriculum construction of a modern *pesantren*. Most modern *pesantrens* develop their own English curriculum in order to integrate it into the *pesantren* curriculum that offers a 24-hour education system. This study is a case study research design. It investigates the curriculum profile of the modern *pesantren* and its alumni's perception of the curriculum. The curriculum developer, the English teachers, and alumni who are currently studying at English departments are involved in this study. In collecting the data, a semi structured-interview, documents, and observations are used in order to get a clear description of the curriculum. The interview schedules were prepared by adapting Raihani's work on the Curriculum Construction in the Indonesian *Pesantren* guided by Posner's and Porter's curriculum framework and the Kirkpatrick's Four Level of Training Evaluation for alumni. The data were analyzed by following Creswell's data analysis and interpretation process. This study reveals what, why, and how the English curriculum is developed, arranged and applied in the modern *pesantren*. The English curriculum in this modern *pesantren* integrates two different curricula, which is the result of the adjustments that were made by the *kyai* as the decision-maker in terms of policies. Moreover, English teaching and learning are not only conducted during formal education inside the classroom but also outside classroom activities. Recommendations in order to get more comprehensive data are also provided.
