



CHAPTER V CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This last chapter presents the conclusions and suggestions of the study. The conclusions are made based on findings and discussions. And then the suggestion are specified for further research and are also intended for those who would like to acquire benefits by reading this paper.

5.1 Conclusions

As explained earlier, the aim of this research is to observe the tokens of word formation types uttered in movie scripts entitled *Bring it on 3: All or Nothing* and *Stealth* as well as to discover the context of situation leading to the use of those tokens.

Based on the findings and its discussions, there are some conclusions that can be drawn. First, the tokens found in both movie scripts are various and classified into several types of word formation. Some of the tokens are BFF, AAA, cheer-ocracy, warplane, caf and beacon. Second, it is known that the most popular word formation process uttered in both movie scripts is acronym. Third, the use of those tokens is also various depending on the context of situations. It might be uttered in the teenagers' daily conversation or military communication fields. It could also be uttered between friends, colleagues or among superior-subordinate, within both formal and informal situations.

5.2 Suggestions

Word formation process is an interesting phenomenon of language change that could happen in human's life. It could happen due to the trend, lifestyle, as well as the demand towards time and space limitations. The study of word formation process is reasonably wide. But this research is only focusing on the use of word formation in teenagers' daily conversation and military communication fields.

There might be some other fields using more word formation types. Thus, for further research on those other fields or other situations and conditions, there are some suggestions that can be considered. First, in order to get good results of the research, it would be better for the researcher to have more literature reviews on the topic. Second, other fields such as medicine, politics, economics or law are interesting subject to be investigated. Third, the internet chat room, short message service, newspaper, magazine or blog are also remarkable resource to be observed. The last but not least, some other types of word formation besides acronym, blend, and clipping are also available to be explored.

Hopefully, this research would be valuable for those who are betrothed to the field of linguistic in particular and communication in general.
