**Chapter III** 

Methodology

This chapter focuses on explaining several explanations regarding the

methodology of this research. There are four sub-chapters that are included namely

(1) Research Design, (2) Participant, (3) Data Collection, (4) Data Instrument, and

(5) Data Analysis.

1.1. Research Design

This study investigated the students' perspective towards challenges during

synchronous learning via WhatsApp group. Thus, the researcher decided to choose

qualitative design in order to get deeper information and understanding regarding

the students' perspective towards challenges during synchronous learning via

WhatsApp.

Particularly, the researcher chose a case study approach to gain deeper insight

into their perspectives towards the challenges during synchronous learning via

WhatsApp group especially in speaking skills. A case study is designed to

investigate the specific research questions and seeks evidence which is there in the

case setting (Gillham, 2000). This case study was employed to figure out the

students' perspective towards challenges during synchronous learning via

WhatsApp group. The researcher was curious about students' perspective towards

the challenges faced during synchronous learning via WhatsApp Group during the

pandemic era.

1.2. Participants

This study was conducted at one of the senior high schools in Bandung, West

Java. Several participants from XI grade of SMA in Bandung participated in this

study. This grade was chosen since they have been learning material synchronously

via WhatsApp during this pandemic era. Moreover, the writer believes that they are

at an appropriate age so their perspective was more logical and valid. There were

seven students who participated in the interview session who have been chosen

from the questionnaire responses. They were chosen to represent those who chose

"agree", "hesitate", and "disagree" regarding the statement about finding speaking

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challenges during synchronous learning via WhatsApp group. Those participants

written in initial names due to their privacy and in order to avoid confusion since

the initial names can help readers to indicate who the owner of the statements is.

Those initial names are SN, IG, NA, WR, AA, KM, and JA.

1.3.Data Collection

The researcher distributed the questionnaire to the students regarding their

perspectives toward the challenges during synchronous learning via WhatsApp

group especially in speaking skills as supporting data. The questionnaire that was

utilized in this research is close-ended questions in Likert scale since it is useful and

connected with the issue of the research (Creswell, 2009). Other than that, the

researcher conducted a semi-structured interview as the main data since it is

considered as an appropriate approach to pull elements from both, open-ended and

close-ended, and put them into distinctive packages (Adams, 2004). This approach

supported the validity of the data since this approach can be flexible to get the

deeper information using "why" and "what" questions.

1.4. Data Instruments

There are 2 instruments that were used in this research namely questionnaire

and interview. The statements and questions were written in Indonesian in order to

avoid misunderstanding regarding the questions. There are 10 statements included

in the questionnaire. The statements of the questionnaire have been attached in the

appendix of this research. The scale options to respond to those questions were

starting from "Strongly Agree", "Agree", "Hesitate", "Disagree", and "Strongly

Disagree".

Meanwhile, the questions for the interview consist of 12 main questions. Those

questions were written by referring to the questionnaire to get deeper information

from the result of the questionnaire. There are several following questions that were

not included in this instrument since the following questions were asked to gain

more information regarding their answers. The questions of the interview have been

attached in the appendix of this research

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## 1.5. Data Analysis

The findings from questionnaire and semi-structured interviews that have been conducted by the researcher have been collected in one archive. The data from the questionnaire were analyzed by interpreting the percentage of the responses regarding the statements. Meanwhile, the data from the interview were analyzed by categorizing them into themes and drawing conclusions from the responses.
